Anatomy of Holy Light

Everything you need to illuminate your home on Hanukkah



How-tos & pro tips:

Not to be a stickler, but...

A menorah (meh-noh-rah), which has only seven candleholders, was the lamp used in the ancient holy temple in Jerusalem — now a symbol of Judaism and an emblem of Israel. A hanukkiah (ha-noo-kee-yah), however, has nine candlesticks — one for each night of Hanukkah, and an extra one to light the others.

How to set up & light:

Many of us place the candles in the *hanukkiah* from right to left, and then light them left to right. (After an exhaustive Google and rabbi search, we still don't know why. Some traditions aren't easily explained!)

The "9th" candle:

There are 8 nights on Hanukkah, but 9 candles in a hanukkiah. The extra candle is for the *shamash*, or "helper" candle. Light the *shamash* candle first, and use it to light the other candles, left to right. After lighting, put the *shamash* back in its spot and recite the blessings!

On Hanukkah, visibility is everything:

According to tradition, placing your *hanukkiah* near your front window brings light into a world that could frankly use more light. Publicizing the beautiful light from your *hanukkiah* also reminds us that miracles are heightened when they are shared. The light from your *hanukkiah* increases with every night, symbolizing our hope for the blessings in our lives to increase over time too.

What to say:

Night 1: Blessing over the Hanukkah candles, blessing for Hanukkah, and *shehecheyanu*

Nights 2-8: Only the blessing over the Hanukkah candles and the blessing for Hanukkah

Blessing over Hanukkah candles:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֶלֹחֵינוּ, מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קְדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיוּ וְצִוֵּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנָכָּה

Transliteration:

Baruch atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech ha'olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Translation:

Praised are You, Source of light, Who made us holy through Your commandments and commanded us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

Blessing for Hanukkah:

ַּבָּרוּךְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֶלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁעָשָׂה נִסִּים לַאֲבוֹתֵינוּ. וְאָמּוֹתֵינוּ בַּיַמִים הַהֵּם בַּזְּמֵן הַזֵּה

Transliteration:

Baruch atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech ha'olam, sheasah nisim la'avoteinu bayamim hahem bazman hazeh.

Translation:

Praised are You, Bringer of seasons, Who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in those ancient days at this season.

Shehecheyanu

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֶחֱיָנוּ וְקְיְּמָנוּ וְהָגִּיעָנוּ לזמן הזה

Transliteration:

Baruch atah Adonai, Elohenu Melech ha'olam, shehecheyanu, v'kiyimanu, v'higiyanu la'zman hazeh.

Translation:

Praised are You, Source of life, Who has given us life and sustained us and enabled us to reach this exact moment.
