## THE FOUR GLASSES OF WINE

The Passover Seder is a home-based ritual that combines education, food, singing, and storytelling, all in a particular order. While all Seders follow the same order, there are many ways to tell the Passover story.

This guided wine tasting offers an alternative Passover celebration that incorporates Passover storytelling and rituals along with Honeymoon Israel's much-loved conversational prompts.

### Setting the Story

To get started at your wine tasting, share the following with your guests before you begin:

Throughout the Passover Seder, we drink four cups of wine. This tradition originates in verses from the Torah, where God makes four promises to the Israelites:

“Therefore, say to the Israelites: ‘I am the Eternal, and I will bring you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians. I will free you from being slaves to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment. I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God.’” (Exodus 6:6-7)

Every people, every culture, and every community has experiences both ancient and modern that connect to the story of Passover. The power of the Passover story is that the experience of slavery, a journey towards freedom, and a hope for redemption are universal experiences.

Tonight we'll celebrate Passover by tasting four wines and considering how these four promises connect to our individual and shared experiences.
